Message From the Dean

Greetings!

Fall is quickly upon us — at least today as I'm writing it feels like fall as opposed to the late August date the calendar is showing! With the coming of fall we have the onset of so many wonderful opportunities for personal and professional development. It is my hope that you will

find the offerings of the RRV AGO useful and interesting to you. First up:

September General Meeting

What: General Meeting, Music Swap, CD Exchange

Why:

- (1) To discuss our future as a viable chapter
- to raise funds for contribution to the AGO Annual Fund
- (3) to explore the programs for the upcoming
- (4) to join in fellowship with other organists and organ lovers as we share music and cds

This meeting is EXTREMELY important to all of us for several reasons. First and foremost, we, as a chapter, are at a significant crossroads due to declining membership and member participation. As it stands now, if only 1 member of the board cannot be present at a board meeting for any reason, we lack a quorum to do business. Do you realize that NO ONE outside of the board itself has volunteered to chair any committee beyond the newsletter! We are without a treasurer and 3 at-large board members (actually it should be 4 but Bill Tweeten has been gracious in continuing on as an at-large member). We are without a program chair, publicity chair, archive chair, membership chair, placement chair, chaplain, registrar, or professional concerns chair (and the list goes on, believe me). Simply put, we are now at a critical time for this chapter and I'm certain that not one of us, when asked to serve either as a board member or committee chair,

realized the gravity of our situation. Our future truly depends upon each and every one of us.

Consequently, at the September meeting, we face one of three difficult choices: (1) hobble along as we are with extremely limited programming and an even more limited community impact (2) change the bylaws of the chapter to reduce the number of board members necessary to do business (provided we have at least 25% of the membership present to vote) or (3) DISBAND. Of course there is another alternative, we can each agree that the RRV-AGO is an important organization for us and for our community and we can somehow find some time to participate in some way beyond just paying our dues and attending an occasional meeting or concert.

Of course these decisions are not to be made lightly, and a necessary vote of the chapter is required for any action regarding the size of the board. However it is imperative that this be known – if we fail to come together as a chapter and take action very soon, the choice as to whether we disband or not will be taken from our hands

In my coffee meetings with many of you and via the survey results themselves, it has become clear that there have been difficult moments of disagreement within our chapter and these have cut a deep swath. I understand this clearly and honor each position. As dean, however, my continuing challenges for you are these: are these disagreements going to be the final statement of the RRV AGO or is this chapter worth saving? Are we at a turning point where it is time for us to look forward to a creative, exciting future for organ and organ music in our region or is it time to simply let an old organization go quietly the way of so many others? Clearly, these are challenges we must face together with honesty and professionalism and our September meeting is intended to be, in a clear and concise way, a litmus test for our viability as a chapter.

Please plan to join us as we seek solutions to these challenges and <u>don't forget to bring any unwanted scored or cds for exchange</u>. The more materials we have to share the more fun we will have discovering new treasures!

Board Meeting Notes



The AGO board meeting was held on Thursday, August 21, 2009 at noon at Boulger Funeral Home. The following people were in attendance: Michael Olson, Erich Knapp, Bill Tweten, Peggy Johnson, Anna Goodin-Hayes, Gaylord Fagerland.

It is to be noted that, since there was not a quorum of board members present on July 17, it was NOT an official board meeting and those minutes should be amended to read Minutes of DISCUSSION by AGO Board Members on Thursday, July 17, 2009. The motion was approved as amended.

There was much discussion as to how to get former members back in the fold. Bill read off a list of former AGO members from the past ten years or so. Several board members said that they would call different people to see if they would be interested in joining us again – and to perhaps find out why they were not currently members, or why they had let their membership lapse.

On Sunday, September 20 at Gethsemane Cathedral at 3:00 p.m. a discussion will take place regarding "what to do next" in terms of our chapter. It is imperative that all chapter members – or, at least, a quorum – be present to speak their minds and hearts. We're going to have a music exchange – so bring music you no longer are using to exchange with others. We're also going to have a CD sale – bring used CDs which will be sold at a nominal fee, the proceeds of which will go towards the AGO Annual Fund.

The organ recital and master class presented by Kim Kasling will be held, respectively, on Friday, October 30 at 8:00 p.m. and on Saturday, October 31 at 10:00 a.m.

Michael will check with Peter Nygaard to see if his organ students will be presenting a fall student recital in November as they did this past school year. We would like to host a reception for the students, their parents, and those in attendance at the recital. We were going to do this in the spring last year, but Concordia was in flood-fighting mode at the time.

Discussion took place over whether or not to have the Christmas Carol Sing-along as has been done in past years. It has been decided, at least for now, that this event will not take place this December. Instead, individual chapter members are encouraged to publicize their own events.


