

Composer, Organist David Cherwien in Residence At Concordia College in February, 2018

Well known composer and organist David Cherwien will be on the Concordia College campus February 810, 2018. Two major public events are scheduled along with rehearsals and open forum times for the
students. First, David will plan, rehearse, and present a HYMN FESTIVAL at Trinity Lutheran Church,
Moorhead on Friday evening, February 9, 2018. The program will begin at 7pm. Then, on Saturday,
February 10, Mr. Cherwien will present a MASTERCLASS in hymn playing and literature for area
organists. The workshop will be held at First Lutheran Church, Fargo (pending any unforeseen funeral
services) from 9:30am-12noon. AGO members and friends are encouraged to attend either or both events.
THERE IS NO ADMISSION CHARGE FOR EITHER EVENT. If any organists wish to play for Mr.
Cherwien on Saturday's Masterclass, please contact Peggy Johnson directly as time is somewhat limited.

David M. Cherwien, born in 1957, is currently serving as Director of Music at Mt. Olive Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, MN. In 2002 he was appointed Music Director for the National Lutheran Choir, also based in the Twin Cities. He also held full time parish music positions in the Minneapolis/St. Paul area, Chicago, Seattle and Berlin, Germany. Mr. Cherwien completed his Doctor of Music Arts degree in Organ Performance and the Master of Arts degree in Theory and Composition, both from the University of Minnesota. His undergraduate work was in organ performance and music education at Augsburg College in Minneapolis where he was honored as Distinguished Alumni in the fall of 2000.

His workshops on church music, service playing and improvisation, and his hymn festivals and other worship leadership roles have brought him to many parts of the country. Quote: "As a renowned church organist, conductor, composer and improviser, David Cherwien brings creativity to hymns of various traditions and styles. He has won national acclaim as a leader of congregational song with hymn festivals that are always inspiring. With innovative merging of organ, piano, instruments, and voices, his music enfolds the participants and transports them to an encounter with the sublime. Through this expression of faith, Mr. Cherwien bears witness that music is a glorious gift of God." Pilgrim Lutheran Church, Fine Arts Series 1997, Indianapolis, IN.

TO ALL AGO MEMBERS,

Registration is now open for the 2018 AGO National Convention to be held in Kansas City, July 2-6, 2018.

After years of planning, we have assembled an incredible program of works-class organists, choirs, workshops, and continuing education opportunities. Creative worship services and world premieres of new organ and choral works by renowned lyricists and composers will be showcased in beautiful and historical organ venues.

2018 marks the 100th anniversary of the end of WWI, which is of particular significance to Kansas City, home of the National WWI Museum and Memorial. Both of our convention hotels sit in the shadow of the Museum and Memorial. Much of our programming will reflect on the ways in which the Great War impacted and influenced the arts world.

Convention housing will be at the Sheraton Kansas City Hotel at Crown Center and its sister property, the Westin Kansas City at Crown Center. Registration, Exhibits and Workshops will be at the Sheraton, which will serve as the Convention Headquarters.

Gratefully Celebrating the Life of Norma Halverson

Norma Ellingson Halverson grew up in Bismarck, ND, playing piano for school and church. She studied organ at the MacPhail School in Minneapolis, MN and attended Lutheran Bible Institute. She studied organ locally with Ruth Berge, and was her assistant organist at First Lutheran Church, Fargo, for a time. Norma met her husband Curtis while singing in the choir at First Lutheran. They married in 1958 and had two sons, Alan and Paul. Norma was a long-time member of AGO. She was full time organist at First United Methodist Church, Fargo, for 36 years, retiring only when forced to for health reasons. Her student, Sally Harmon, followed her as organist at First UMC. Norma played for countless church services, weddings, funerals, recitals and other musical events, including being the accompanist for the FMAMC Noteables. She was also an original member of the Fargo Moorhead Music Club's Piano Quartet group. She taught piano and organ in the community for more than forty years and continued to sing in church choirs wherever she was, whether in Fargo or Mesa, Arizona during the winters. She played the orchestra bells in the New Horizons Band when she couldn't use both hands at the piano anymore. She was a fearless performer, a marvelous duet partner, and leaves behind a legacy of music in the community with her many students who continue to play and perform. Norma passed away on Thursday, November 23, 2017 at the age of 90 years.
